Paul Krugman

Paul Krugman is a Nobel Prize winning economist, author, intellectual and *New York Times* op-ed columnist. He is currently a professor of economics and international affairs at Princeton University and a centenary professor at the London School of Economics.

Krugman won the Nobel Memorial Prize in Economics in 2008 “for his analysis of trade patterns and location of economic activity.” He is best known for his work in international economics, trade theory, economic geography, and international finance.

He is a member of the Group of Thirty and the Council on Foreign Relations. His latest book is *The Return of Depression Economics and the Crisis of 2008*.

John B. Taylor

John B. Taylor is an award winning economist, professor, and public servant. He is currently a Senior Fellow at the Hoover Institution and a Professor of Economics at Stanford University. He is also a member of the California Governor's Council of Economic Advisors.

He has had a long and distinguished career teaching at Stanford, Princeton and Columbia universities. He is also a longstanding public servant. He served as Undersecretary of Treasury for International Affairs for a number of years, where he was responsible for U.S. policies in international finance. He was also a member of the President's Council of Economic Advisers during the Ford and George H. W. Bush administrations.



He has also been awarded numerous awards for excellence in teaching and economics including the Adam Smith Award from the National Association for Business Economics and the Alexander Hamilton Award for his overall leadership in international finance at the U.S. Treasury.

He was awarded the Treasury Distinguished Service Award for his work in currency reform in Iraq, and the Medal of the Republic of Uruguay for his work in resolving the 2002 financial crisis.

Taylor's fields of expertise are monetary policy, fiscal policy, and international economics.
