Timothy Geithner

Timothy Geithner is currently serving as the 75th Secretary of the United States Treasury. Before his nomination, he served as the ninth president and chief executive officer of the Federal Bank of New York for five years. During that time he became a permanent member of the Federal Open Market Committee, the group responsible for formulating U.S. monetary policy.

From 2001 until 2003 Geithner worked for the International Monetary Fund as director of the Policy Development and Review Department and joined the Council on Foreign

Relations as a Senior Fellow in the International Economics department.

Geithner began working for the Department of the Treasury in 1988 under five Secretaries of the Treasury in various capacities including Under Secretary of the Treasury for International Affairs under Secretaries Robert Rubin and Lawrence Summers.

Before joining the Treasury Department, Geithner worked for Kissinger Associates, Inc. He graduated from the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies with a master's in International Economics and East Asian Studies in 1985. He has lived abroad in East Africa, India, Thailand, China, and Japan.
