Roubini says it is a great book about the financial crisis.

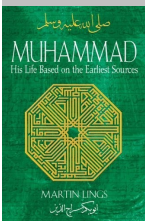


Mort Zuckerman

by Andrew Roberts

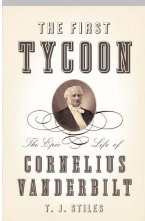

Tony Blair

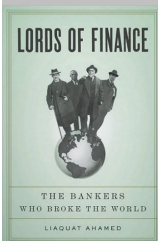
Muhammad: His Life Based on the Earliest Sources by Martin Lings.
