Complaint

The Affiant, Det. Todd R Iddings, states that on 9/11/2009 at 06:35 in FAYETTE County, Kentucky, the above named defendant unlawfully: Committed the offense of Murder, KRS 507.020, UOR 09030, with intent to cause the death of another he caused the death of Amanda Rose by firearm. On 9/11/09 at approximately 0635, units were dispatched to 541 W. Short St. in regards to a shooting. Upon their arrival, they located Amanda Ross suffering from gunshot wounds. Ms. Ross died of her injuries at UK Medical Center, and her death was ruled a homicide. Neighbors described hearing a scream, and 4 to 5 gunshots. Ms. Ross was the petitioner for a Domestic Violence Order against Stephen R. Nunn and it is active ordering no contact, no violent contact, and no destruction of property. Investigators began to attempt to locate Mr. Nunn to interview him to verify his whereabouts. Investigators learned from friends and family members that over the last several days prior to this incident, Mr. Nunn was depressed and was speaking about death. He further asked his ex-wife to go to Glasgow, KY to take care of his girls. Through these interviews I learned that on 9/10/09, Mr. Nunn traded cars with one of his daughters and may have been in his daughter's car. I was able to discover a vehicle registered to his daughter, and was able obtain identifying information for this vehicle. I also learned that due to Mr. Nunn's mental state, and conversations about death he may go to his family farm in Barren County, Kentucky or where his parents were buried near the family farm in Hart County, Kentucky to harm himself. I contacted the Kentucky State Police Post 3, in Bowling Green, Kentucky and relayed the information of my investigation, and requested they attempt to locate Mr. Nunn. Troopers checked the family farm and did not locate Mr. Nunn or the vehicle. Troopers then checked the cemetery located beside Cosby Methodist Church in Hart County where Mr. Nunn's parents are buried. Troopers located the vehicle that I alerted them to behind the church unoccupied. As they searched the area, Troopers located Mr. Nunn near the rear of the cemetery. As they approached him he was armed with a 5 shot .38 special revolver and fired one shot. The weapon that was in Mr. Nunn's possession was seized and upon inspection the shot he fired in the presence of KSP was the last shot emptying the revolver, leaving five empty shell casings. Troopers

were able take him into to custody. Mr. Nunn had self-inflicted wounds to his wrists, and made statements about ending his life. Statements made by Mr. Nunn to law enforcement officers as he was being treated at the scene and on the way to the hospital were that he was sorry for not completing the job, that he spoke of revenge, and going to the penitentiary. At the hospital he was interviewed by Detective Sgt. Combs of KSP and he advised that due to an ongoing domestic violence incident he had lost his job, had lost money, could not get a job, had been a burden to his family and was at the end of his rope and wanted revenge. However when asked directly if he caused Ms. Ross' death he either evaded answering the question or advised he did not want to answer that question. Mr. Nunn was charged by KSP for Wanton Endangerment 1st, and was admitted to the hospital for his self inflicted injuries. A search warrant was obtained for his vehicle and the search of his vehicle revealed a 7 page letter that again addressed Mr. Nunn's legal problems with Ms. Ross and the problems they have caused him, and the letter speaks of revenge, and the letter speaks of Ms. Ross in derogatory terms. Also located in his daughter's vehicle that was in close proximity to his arrest was his wallet. Investigators contacted a credit card company who advised that Mr. Nunn's credit card was used at 0650 am in Versailles, KY which is approximately 15 minutes after the homicide. This is on a direct route between where the homicide occurred and where he was located in Hart County. Also observed on the car was that steps were taken to obscure the identity of the car. Preliminary Ballistic examinations were performed on the projectiles recovered from Ms. Ross' body at Autopsy to be that of a .38 special caliber, and Mr. Nunn's handgun was a .38 special revolver. Further tests are pending.
