



Interviews with 1,006 adult Americans conducted by telephone by Opinion Research Corporation on October 27-30, 2010. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 3 percentage points.

The sample also includes 921 interviews among registered voters (plus or minus 3 percentage points) and 542 interviews among likely voters (plus or minus 4 percentage points).
