REPUBLICAN SWEEP LIKELY IN RACES FOR OHIO GOVERNOR, U.S. SENATE

Cincinnati, OH--The final Ohio Poll for the 2010 election season projects victories for Republican candidates in races for Ohio governor and U.S. Senate.

After allocation of undecided voters to the candidates they are most likely to support, the gubernatorial race in Ohio stands at former U.S. Rep. John Kasich (R) 52.0 percent, Governor Ted Strickland (D) 47.7 percent, and Other 0.3 percent.

After allocation of undecided voters to the candidates they are most likely to support, the U.S. Senate race in Ohio stands at former U.S. Rep. Rob Portman (R) 60.0 percent, Lt. Governor Lee Fisher (D) 39.2 percent, and Other 0.8 percent.

These findings are based on the latest Ohio Poll, conducted by the Institute for Policy Research at the University of Cincinnati. The Ohio Poll is sponsored by the University of Cincinnati. Nine hundred thirty (930) probable voters were interviewed between October 27 and 31, 2010. In 95 of 100 cases, the statewide estimates will be accurate to plus or minus 3.2 percent.
