

Interviews with 860 adult Americans conducted by telephone by ORC International on August 1, 2011. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 3.5 percentage points.

The sample includes 716 interviews among landline respondents and 144 interviews among cell phone respondents.
