A search of that trailer disclosed property of 2 of the girls that have disappeared (Alexandria and Kyliyah). Interviews with Mayes' mother and wife disclosed that on or about April 27, 2012, Adam Mayes was seen digging in his mother's backyard at [REDACTED] Guntown, Mississippi. On May 4, 2012, FBI Evidence Recovery Team began excavation of the site at [REDACTED] Guntown, Mississippi. Two bodies were recovered from that address and have been identified as Jo Ann Bain and her daughter, Adrienne Bain.

During a non-custodial interview with Teresa Mayes, wife of Adam Mayes, she did admit to agents from the TBI that she was involved with the removal and/or confinement of 2 of these individuals and the removal of 2 corpses from Hardeman County, Tennessee, in that she assisted by driving a vehicle containing victims from Hardeman County, Tennessee, to Union County, Mississippi. Teresa Mayes stated that Adam Mayes intended to take Alexandria Bain 12 yoa, and Kyliyah Bain 8 yoa from their home in Hardeman County, Tennessee. Additionally, she stated that she was present while Adam Mayes killed Jo Ann Bain in a garage adjacent to the house at [REDACTED] in Hardeman County, Tennessee. Teresa also stated that Adam Mayes killed 14 year old Adrienne Bain at the [REDACTED] Hardeman County, Tennessee location. Both murders were directly a part of the kidnapping of Alexandria Bain 12 yoa, and Kyliyah Bain 8 yoa.

Adam Mayes and Teresa Mayes confined and removed Alexandria Bain 12 yoa, and Kyliyah Bain 8 yoa, from Hardeman County, Tennessee, in a manner that substantially interfered with their liberty. Alexandria Bain 12 yoa, and Kyliyah Bain 8 yoa, were under the age of 13 at the time of their removal or confinement.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, Adam Mayes and Teresa Mayes are being charged with 2 counts of Especially Aggravated Kidnapping related to Alexandria Bain (12 yoa) and Kyliyah Bain (8 yoa). Adam Mayes and Teresa Mayes are also being charged with First Degree Murder in the deaths of Jo Ann Bain and Adrienne Bain.

I, the affiant named below, after being sworn, state under oath that on or about April 27, 2012 in Hardeman County, Tennessee, ADAM MAYES committed the offense of **ESPECIALLY AGGRAVATED KIDNAPPING**, a violation of T.C.A. Section 39-13-305. I further state under oath that the essential facts constitution the offense, the sources of my information, and the reasons why this information is believable and reliable are as follows:

On April 27, 2012, Gary Bain notified Hardeman County Sheriff's Department regarding the disappearance of his wife (Jo Ann Bain) and his 3 daughters (Adreienne Bain 14 yoa, Alexandria Bain 12 yoa, and Kyliyah Bain 8 yoa) from their residence on [REDACTED] in Hardeman County, Tennessee. Through investigation by Hardeman County Sheriff's Department, TBI, MBI, and the FBI, Adam Mayes was developed as a suspect. Mayes, by his own admission, was the last person to see the 4 missing persons prior to their disappearance. When TBI requested an interview with Mayes, Mayes took flight and has not yet been located. In the process of searching for Mayes, it was discovered that Mayes had rented a trailer in Union County, Mississippi. A search of that trailer disclosed property of 2 of the girls that have disappeared (Alexandria and Kyliyah). Interviews with Mayes' mother and wife disclosed that on or about April 27, 2012, Adam Mayes was seen digging in his mother's backyard at [REDACTED] Guntown, Mississippi. On May 4, 2012, FBI Evidence Recovery Team began excavation of the site at [REDACTED] Guntown, Mississippi. Two bodies were recovered from that address and have been identified as Jo Ann Bain and her daughter, Adreienne Bain.

During a non-custodial interview with Teresa Mayes, wife of Adam Mayes, she did admit to agents from the TBI that she was involved with the removal and/or confinement of 2 of these individuals and the removal of 2 corpses from Hardeman County, Tennessee, in that she assisted by driving a vehicle containing victims from Hardeman County, Tennessee, to Union County, Mississippi. Teresa Mayes stated that Adam Mayes intended to take Alexandria Bain 12 yoa, and Kyliyah Bain 8 yoa from their home in Hardeman County, Tennessee. Additionally, she stated that she was present while Adam Mayes killed Jo Ann Bain in a garage adjacent to the house at [REDACTED] in Hardeman County, Tennessee. Teresa also stated that Adam Mayes killed 14 year old Adreienne Bain at the [REDACTED] Hardeman County, Tennessee location. Both murders were directly a part of the kidnapping of Alexandria Bain 12 yoa, and Kyliyah Bain 8 yoa.

Adam Mayes and Teresa Mayes confined and removed Alexandria Bain 12 yoa, and Kyliyah Bain 8 yoa, from Hardeman County, Tennessee, in a manner that substantially interfered with their liberty. Alexandria Bain 12 yoa, and Kyliyah Bain 8 yoa, were under the age of 13 at the time of their removal or confinement.

Based upon these facts and circumstances, Adam Mayes and Teresa Mayes are being charged with 2 counts of Especially Aggravated Kidnapping related to Alexandria Bain (12 yoa) and Kyliyah Bain (8 yoa). Adam Mayes and Teresa Mayes are also being charged with First Degree Murder in the deaths of Jo Ann Bain and Adreienne Bain.
