DETAILS:

On 02/26/2012 at approximately 1940 hours, I was contacted by CST D. Smith, and she told me that there had been a homicide at Retreat at Twin Lakes. Sgt. Joseph Santiago also called me with the same information. While en route I called Captain R. O'Conner and told him what I had been told and that I was responding. I arrived at approximately 2010 hours and met with CST Smith who briefed me on the scene. It was dark and there were intermittent showers.

I walked through the scene with CST Smith and she pointed out items of evidence that were already located. There was a Honda key with a small flash light on the ring, a cell phone, a larger flashlight, two plastic grocery type bags, a first aid kit, and discarded medical supplies. The victim's body was covered with a yellow plastic blanket with an Arizona Ice Tea can on it. I then assisted CST Smith in photographing the scene while we waited for the Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office investigator and transport services to arrive. After CST Smith completed her initial photographs of the scene I assisted her in measuring the items on the scene for her sketch, she then collected the items. The Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office arrived on scene and began to examine and move the victim. The victim had \$40.15 in US currency, a bag of skittles candy, a red 7-11 red lighter in his pockets, headphones next to him, and a photo pin on his sweatshirt. After making inquiries I was told that the Arizona Ice Tea can was from inside the victim's Sweatshirt pocket and had come out while first aid was being given. When the ME investigator lifted the victim's clothing I saw a single gun shot wound to the chest. The victim was then transported for the ME by ilvery. After a visual search of the area failed to turn up the cartridge I got the metal detector and began to scan the area where the victim had lain. I did one sweep of the area with negative results and then reset the sensitivity of the metal detector. As I started again I heard a strong tone and looked in the area. I did not see anything so I marked the area, and instructed CST Smith to check the area again visually and I moved on. Before I got to the end of the sweep CST Smith told me that she had found casing just inches from where I had placed the marker. CST Smith documented and recovered a 9mm Luger S&B cartridge case. We retrieved our equipment and returned to the Sanford Police Department.

On 02/26/2012 at approximately 2321 hours I again met with CST Smith, officers and investigators and I observed CST Smith take photographs of the subjects' injuries, hands, collect possible gun shot residue using a GSR kit. This took place in a Sanford Police Department interview room 2. We then had to wait for the subject's wife to respond with a change of clothes and the clothes that the subject was wearing were collected. CST Smith collected and logged all of the evidence.

On 02/27/2012 at approximately 1236 hours I responded to Retreat at Twin Lakes and assisted CST Smith in photographing the scene during daylight.

On 03/05/12 I was asked to check the round count for the recovered firearm. I examined the crime scene photos and our café report and determined that:

Recovered at the scene were;

Kel-Tec PF-9

6 live rounds in the magazine

1 loose live round when cleared that had been in the chamber

1 spent casing

Kel-Tec PF-9 round count

All rounds are accounted for if the firearm was fully loaded at the time of the shooting.

Fully loaded the Kel-Tec PF-9 is 7+1, seven rounds in the magazine and one in the chamber.

3/19/12

On 2/28/2012 at approximately 1040 hrs I was walking through the Major Crimes office area and I observed Investigator Serino at his desk playing 911 recordings for Trayvon Martin's father and a female. I decided to stop and stay in the area once I realized that the 911 recordings were being played incase I could render any assistance to the family or Investigator Serino. I was standing by the walkway and a post was separating me from directly seeing Mr. Martin's reactions. Before the 911 call of a person yelling in the background was played, Investigator Serino warned them that there was disturbing content. I could not hear Mr. Martin's reply and Investigator Serino proceeded to play the recording. I did hear Investigator Serino ask Mr. Martin if that was his son yelling in the background. I did not hear a reply. Mr. Martin was talking very softly when I did hear him. I do not know what order the tapes were played in as I was not directly involved with talking to Mr. Martin.

PROBABLE CAUSE

Investigative findings show that on 2/26/2012 at approximately 1912 hrs George Michael Zimmerman initiated a nonemergency call to Sanford Police dispatch to report a suspicious person.

Investigation reveals that Martin was in fact running generally in the direction of where he was staying as a guest in the neighborhood.

Investigation reveals that on August 3, August 4, and October 6, 2011, and February 2, 2012, George Zimmerman reported suspicious persons, all young Black males, in the Retreat neighborhood to the Sanford Police Department. According to records checks, all of Zimmerman's suspicious persons calls while residing in the Retreat neighborhood have identified Black males as the subjects.


At 1916 hours, a 911 call, placed by [REDACTED] was received where Zimmerman can be heard in the background frantically yelling for help. At 1917 hours a gunshot was heard in the background of the [REDACTED] 911 call, and moments later Officer Tim Smith arrived on scene. The encounter between George Zimmerman and Trayvon Martin was ultimately avoidable by Zimmerman, if Zimmerman had remained in his vehicle and awaited the arrival of law enforcement, or conversely if he had identified himself to Martin as a concerned citizen and initiated dialog in an effort to dispel each party's concern. There is no indication that Trayvon Martin was involved in any criminal activity at the time of the encounter.

Attempts to locate additional witnesses have consisted of multiple canvasses of the neighborhood on the evenings of 2/26/2012, 2/27/2012, and 3/1/2012. The distribution of informational flyers throughout the gated community was completed on 2/29/2012 and a community meeting, which was held on March 1, 2012.

All digitally recorded interviews were submitted as evidence, and all forensic laboratory requests are being submitted to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement for analysis.

Based upon the facts and circumstances outlined in this narrative, I believe there exists probable cause for issuance of a capias charging George Michael Zimmerman with Manslaughter, in violation of Ch. 782.07 FS.

This case is being forwarded to the Office of the State's Attorney as a request for capias.

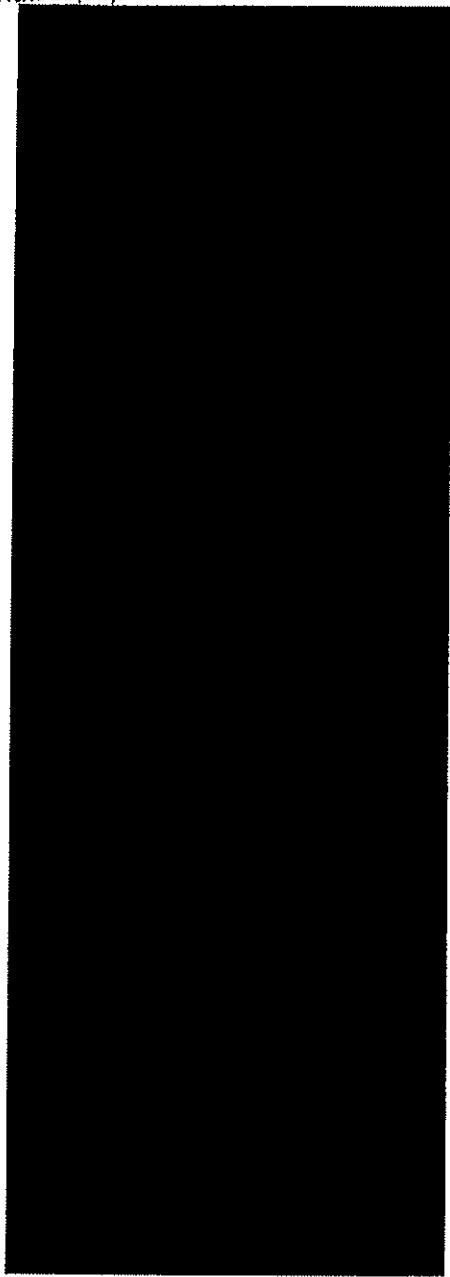



DETAILS:

Case Synopsis:

On 2/26/2012, at the Retreat at Twin Lakes community, located on Oregon Avenue in Sanford, Seminole County, Florida, a twenty-eight year old white male, identified as George Michael Zimmerman and seventeen year old black male, identified as Trayvon Benjamin Martin, engaged in a physical confrontation in a common area behind two rows of townhomes. The incident was witnessed by several people, all of whom called 911 however the initial harmful event has no known eyewitnesses.

Preliminary investigation showed that Zimmerman, a member of his community's Neighborhood Watch Program, observed Martin walking in the community, and perceived Martin as being "suspicious". Zimmerman acted on his suspicion of Martin, and called the Sanford Police non-emergency line. [REDACTED]

Victimology:

The decedent, positively identified by means of a postmortem photograph by his biological father as Trayvon Benjamin Martin, was a 17 year old resident of Miami Gardens, Florida, and a high school student with no criminal background. When asked as to his propensity towards violence, his father, Mr. Tracy Martin, states his son was a well-mannered, non-violent child. A local Miami Gardens Police Department background check revealed one field contact conducted in November of 2011. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] and he had been sent there by his father due to having been suspended for ten days from his high school in Miami Gardens for possession of cannabis. He had been in Sanford for seven days prior to this event.

On 2/26/2012 at approximately 1826 hours, I was notified of a shooting with injuries event by the Seminole County Communications Center, and I was instructed to contact the duty Watch Commander, Lieutenant M. Taylor

At approximately 1930 hours I contacted Lieutenant M. Taylor, via NexTel, and I was informed of the location of the incident, and that one person (unidentified black male) was pronounced dead on scene, and that the individual who shot the decedent, identified as George Michael Zimmerman, had remained on scene, was cooperative, was in police custody. I was told that Zimmerman had been transported to the Sanford Police Department for interviewing purpose. I was also advised that the weapon used was also in police custody.

On arrival at the scene, at approximately 2000 hours, I met with SPD Officer Ricardo Ayala, who produced the preliminary report. Officer Ayala briefed me as to the known circumstances. I was informed by Officer Ayala that an apparent confrontation occurred between the then unidentified black male, later positively identified as Trayvon Benjamin Martin, age 17, and George Michael Zimmerman. Officer Ayala further informed me that during the confrontation, Zimmerman stated that he produced a 9mm semiautomatic pistol (for which he had a valid Florida concealed firearm carry permit), and fired a single round, striking Martin in the chest. Officer Ayala informed me that lifesaving efforts performed by Sgt. R. Raimondo, and Officer T. Smith, and Sanford Fire Rescue proved unsuccessful, and that Martin was pronounced dead on scene by Sanford Fire Rescue 38.

I then interviewed Officer T. Smith, who was the first officer on scene. Officer Smith informed me that upon his arrival he came in contact with George Zimmerman, apparently moments after Zimmerman had shot Trayvon Martin. Officer Smith informed me that Zimmerman offered no resistance while he was placed into custody at gunpoint. He stated that Zimmerman's facial area was bloodied, and the posterior of his clothing was soiled with wet grass, indicative of having recently been on his back on the grass. Officer Smith stated

[REDACTED]

I was also informed that statements made by Zimmerman on scene to Officer T. Smith were corroborated by several witnesses, and led to the possibility of this shooting having been in self-defense. Written statements were obtained from [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Audio recorded statements from these witnesses were conducted at a later date (referred to later in this narrative).

After I learned from Lieutenant Taylor that George Zimmerman had been transported to the Sanford Police Department, I requested Inv. Doris Singleton respond to the police station in order to interview Zimmerman. I contacted Inv. Singleton, informed her of the apparent nature of this matter, and advised her to remove Zimmerman's restraint devices prior to conducting her interview.

I remained on scene and coordinated crime scene processing efforts with Sgt. L. Caisla and Crime Scene Technician D. Smith. The scene was an outdoor crime scene, in a predominately grassy area with a paved walkway between two rows of townhomes, bordered by Retreat View Circle, and Twin Tree Lane. The time of the evening when the shooting occurred was approximately 1916 hours, after sunset, on an overcast evening with sporadic rain showers. The only ambient lighting was produced by the porch lights of several residences, and overall the location can be best described as dark. The decedent lay supine directly behind [REDACTED], covered by a yellow police issued emergency blanket. He was wearing a dark gray hooded pullover sweatshirt, tan pants, and tennis shoes. I observed no blunt force trauma to his head or facial area.

At approximately 2020 hours I spoke with Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office Investigator T. Clark, and requested her response.

At approximately 2030 hours I interviewed [REDACTED] who resides at [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that while inside of his residence he heard a commotion and two "pops" coming from the area behind his residence. Upon exiting his residence to investigate, he encountered a white male, established to be George Zimmerman. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated he did not witness the sequence of events which led up to the confrontation between Martin and Zimmerman. [REDACTED] provided a written statement, and his interview was audio recorded and submitted into evidence.

On 2/26/2012 at approximately 2055 hours I interviewed [REDACTED] who was in her bedroom, stated she heard "loud voices" coming from the area behind her

On 2/26/2012 at approximately 2105 hours I interviewed [REDACTED] [REDACTED] stated that while inside of his residence he heard a commotion coming from the walk way behind his residence. When he investigated, he witnessed a black male, wearing a dark colored "hoodie" on top of a white or Hispanic male who was yelling for help. He elaborated by stating the black male was mounted on the white or Hispanic male and throwing punches "MMA (mixed martial arts) style". He stated he yelled out to the two individuals that he was going to call the police. He then heard a "pop". He stated that after hearing the "pop", he observed the person he had previously observed on top of the other person (the black male wearing the "hoodie") laid out on the grass. Upon inquiry, [REDACTED] stated he did not witness how the confrontation started between the two individuals, and that he could not positively identify either one due to the lighting conditions. [REDACTED] stated he was in his living room at the onset of the commotion, and looked out of his sliding glass door, which placed him approximately 30 feet directly in front from where the physical altercation between Martin and Zimmerman was taking place. [REDACTED] provided a written statement, and his interview was audio recorded and submitted into evidence. [REDACTED] written statement reads as follows:

On 2/26/2012 at approximately 2130 hours, VCME Office Investigator Tara Clark arrived on scene and assumed jurisdiction over the decedent. Initial inspection on the decedent showed no significant trauma, other than a solitary gunshot wound to the chest, just left of midline. The decedent was found to not be in possession of any form of identification, and was transported to the Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office as "John Doe #3". On his person was a can of Arizona brand iced tea, a bag of Skittles candy, and \$40.15 in US currency.

On 02/26/2012 at approximately 2345 hours I spoke with Assistant State Attorney Kelly Jo Hines and apprised her of the circumstances surrounding this case.

On 2/27/2012, at approximately 0920 hours, after learning of a missing persons' complaint in progress at [REDACTED] I responded along with CSO Ed Manning, and SPD Officer B. McIntosh. On arrival I met with Tracy Martin who stated his 17 year old son, Trayvon Martin, had not returned from going to the store sometime on the evening of 2/26. Mr. Martin informed me his son was not from this area, and that his son is visiting from Miami Gardens, and that his son did not have a State of Florida Identification Card or Driver's License. While conversing with Mr. Martin, I noted several physical characteristics he had in common with the decedent, thereby establishing a reasonable factual basis to believe that the decedent was the son of Mr. Martin. Upon presenting Mr. Martin with a photograph of the facial image of the decedent, taken at the scene, positive identification was made in conjunction with Next of Kin notification. I explained the circumstances surrounding the passing of his son, and summoned for a victim's advocate to assist. Victim's Advocate Debra Wagner responded and assisted Mr. Martin and his family.

On 2/27/2012 at 1030 hours, Trayvon Martin underwent a forensic autopsy at the Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office. Preliminary autopsy findings ruled cause of death was injury stemming from a gunshot wound to the chest which perforated the heart organ, manner of death established as homicide. A single projectile was recovered from the chest cavity of the decedent, and submitted into evidence by CST D. Smith.

On 2/27/2012 I was provided with the audio recordings of six (6) 911 calls stemming from this incident, along with a recording of George Zimmerman's non-emergency call.

I reviewed Zimmerman's nonemergency call to SPD dispatch. [REDACTED]

I reviewed the 911 calls, specifically 20120571669, placed by [REDACTED] In the background I could clearly hear a male's voice yelling either "Help" or "Help Me", fourteen (14) times in an approximately 38 second time span. This voice was determined to be that of George Zimmerman, who was apparently yelling for help as he was being battered by Trayvon Martin. Investigator D. Singleton, using information obtained from the Seminole County Sheriff's Office Computer

Aided Dispatch (CAD), established the following timeline:

Event 2012571656

1911:12 Call received from George Zimmerman reporting suspicious person

1913:19 Zimmerman relays suspicious person is running from him

1913:36 Dispatcher asks Zimmerman if he is following suspicious person

1913:36 Dispatcher advises Zimmerman "Okay; we don't need you to do that"

1915:23 Approximate time call with Zimmerman ends

Event 2012571669

1916:43 911 call placed by [REDACTED] where Zimmerman is heard screaming for help

1917:20 Shot fired; screams from Zimmerman cease

Event 20120571671

1917:40 Officer T. Smith arrives on scene

1919:43 Officer T. Smith locates and places Zimmerman in custody

On 2/28/2012 at 1030 hours I met with Tracy Martin, and [REDACTED] at the Sanford Police Department. The purpose for this meeting was to brief the decedent's next of kin as to the progress of this investigation. Mr. Martin, concerned over there being no arrest made in the shooting death of his son, was advised of the nature of this case, and ultimately assured that a proper investigation would be conducted. Mr. Martin acknowledged the complexity of this case prior to departing.

On 02/28/2012, Investigator Trekeil Perkins received a telephone call from an unidentified female. This female, who refused to provide her name, call back number, or any other type of contact information, disclosed to Inv. Perkins that George Zimmerman has racist ideologies, and that he is fully capable of instigating a confrontation that could have escalated to the point of Zimmerman having to use deadly force. Inv. Perkins was able to record a portion of his conversation with this anonymous female and said recording was placed on a compact disc and submitted as evidence. No other information has been obtained to corroborate this anonymous female's information and her identity has not been established.

Research on the prior incident referred to by Zimmerman revealed that Zimmerman, on 2/2/2012, called in a suspicious person at 1460 Retreat View Circle. Subsequent police response showed the person described by Zimmerman as staking out this residence, identified by Zimmerman as a black male, in a black leather jacket, and printed pants, had departed the area prior to police arrival, and criminal offense report was made (SPD Event 20120332595).

On 3/1/2012, at approximately 1900 hours, while conducting a re-canvass of the neighborhood, I located [REDACTED] at [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated she was home on the evening of 2/26/2012 at approximately 1915 hours when she heard a commotion coming from the walkway behind her residence. [REDACTED] states she looked out her sliding glass door and observed two men chasing each other, a fistfight between the two men, and then she heard a gunshot. When asked to clarify her observations, she stated she could not identify either of the two men, but she did state the person in pursuit of the person being pursued was approximately 10' -12' behind. On 3/8/2012 I called and left a message for [REDACTED] in order to coordinate a second interview. On 3/9/2012 at 1826 hours I re-interviewed [REDACTED] at the Sanford Police Department. [REDACTED] stated that what she witnessed was only a "glance" at the happenings outside of her residence, and only after she had removed her contact lenses. Her

vantage point was from the upstairs bedroom of her residence, and she stated the chasing she saw was in the direction towards the "T" where the walkway leads to either Retreat View Circle or Twin Trees Lane. [REDACTED] could not distinguish who was chasing whom, and cannot identify either of the persons she witnessed on the evening of 2/26/2012. This interview was digitally recorded and submitted as evidence.

On 3/1/2012, at approximately 2100 hours, I conducted a telephonic interview with [REDACTED] and was at home at the time of the incident. She states she was in her kitchen when she heard what she interpreted as someone crying, or moaning in desperation, before hearing a gunshot. Upon investigating, she observed a male standing over another individual who was lying on the ground. She states the individual standing over the other individual appeared to be holding the person on the ground by pressing on his back. She stated it was too dark to distinguish who was standing or who was on the ground. [REDACTED] could not provide any other information, however her friend, [REDACTED] who was assisting with translation, was adamant that there was no physical fighting at the time when the gunshot rang out. Based on these statements, I requested both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] appear at the police department for more thorough interviewing in a controlled setting. Both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] agreed to interviewing, which was scheduled for 3/2 at 1830 hours.

On 3/02/2012 at 1856 hours, I re-interviewed [REDACTED] at the Sanford Police Department. [REDACTED] stated she was home at the time of this incident. She stated that while inside of her kitchen, she heard someone crying, just prior to hearing a gunshot ring out. She stated that upon investigating, she observed one individual standing over another individual who was lying on the ground. She called out "what's going on out there?" She stated the person standing over the other person did not respond to her. After repeating "What's going on out there?" the person standing over the other person stated "just call the police". [REDACTED] states she noticed the person on the ground was face down only after police arrived on scene. [REDACTED] could not provide any information pertaining to how the confrontation between the Zimmerman and Martin originated, and she could not articulate anything reference words spoken between the two. When asked to best describe the crying or sobbing she heard, she stated it was if coming from a young person, and the tone was that of fear, and/or complaining. [REDACTED] stated she could not positively identify Zimmerman or Martin due to the poor lighting conditions. [REDACTED] interview was digitally recorded, placed on a compact disc, and submitted into evidence.

On 3/2/2012 at 1120 hours I interviewed [REDACTED] at the Sanford Police Department. [REDACTED] stated she and [REDACTED] were inside of their residence at [REDACTED] on 2/26/2012 at the time of this incident. When asked what she witnessed, she corrected me by stating she did not see anything, but she had heard what she perceived to be arguing coming from the walkway behind her residence. She stated she could not decipher what words were being spoken between the arguing parties, but stated there appeared to be three (3) exchanges of words to the argument. When asked if she was acquainted with George Zimmerman, she replied in the affirmative, and she knows him to be an even-tempered "laid back" type of person. She stated she perceived him as being passionate about the neighborhood watch program, and stated she "could see him" confronting someone he perceived as a threat to the neighborhood. [REDACTED] could not provide any information pertaining to how the violent episode between George Zimmerman and the decedent occurred and stated she was not familiar with the decedent. [REDACTED] interview was digitally recorded, placed on a compact disc, and submitted into evidence.

On 3/2/2012 at 1132 hours, I interviewed [REDACTED] who resides at [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated he was at home on 2/26/2012 at approximately 1910 - 1915 hours. He stated he was with [REDACTED] watching television in the living room of their residence. He stated that the sliding glass door to his residence was wide open. He states he and [REDACTED] heard a "scuffle" or "rustling of bushes" coming from behind his residence, and upon first impression, he thought it might have been some rowdy teenagers. [REDACTED] stated that the tone of voices became more "serious" and then thought it was several people possibly attacking one person. [REDACTED] articulated the sounds he heard as "ah, ah, ah", and then he heard the same voice yelling "help, help!", approximately twenty (20) times. He then heard a "pop", ran upstairs, and then heard someone saying "I've got a gun, I've got a gun", "take my gun from me". Upon inquiry, he stated he did not see anyone due to the fact that in order to see what was going on outside of his residence he would have had to move the blinds over his windows in such a way that the person(s) outside would see [REDACTED] which is something he wanted to avoid out of concern for their personal safety. [REDACTED] could not provide any information pertaining to the origin of the confrontation between Zimmerman and Martin. His interview was digitally recorded and it was placed on a compact disc and submitted into evidence.

On 3/2/2012 at 1914 hours, [REDACTED] arrived at the Sanford Police Department. She resides at [REDACTED] and was home on 2/26/2012 when this incident occurred. She stated that while in the kitchen of the residence with the window open, she heard a "whining" sound, and she didn't hear any words spoken, but she deduced it was a sound of distress. She stated she and her roommate went to the sliding glass door when they heard a gunshot. She stated she observed a male standing over another male who was lying on the ground. She stated she retrieved a telephone and called 911. She stated she does not know why

the incident occurred, and could not provide any other information pertaining to the occurrences prior to her hearing the "whining" sounds she heard. [REDACTED] interview was digitally recorded, placed on a compact disc, and placed into evidence.

On 3/5/2012 at 1700 hours at [REDACTED] I met with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] (age 13). I interviewed [REDACTED] due to the possibility of him being a witness, after learning [REDACTED] had placed a 911 call on 2/26, and she had stated [REDACTED] had told her about "someone being shot". Also present during this interview was [REDACTED] and Investigator D. Singleton. [REDACTED] stated he observed "someone laying on the ground that looked like they couldn't get up and was yelling for help". Upon inquiry, he could not say the race of the person lying on the ground, he looked like he had a red shirt, he didn't hear any arguing, and he didn't see anyone else other than the person on the ground. [REDACTED] impression was that someone had perhaps fallen down due to the wetness of the ground and had possibly broken their leg. [REDACTED] interview was digitally recorded, placed on a compact disc, and submitted into evidence.

On 3/8/2012, this case was presented to ASA James Carter in a meeting conducted at the Sanford Police Department.

On 3/9/2012 I received a fax from Altamonte Family Practice, which contained the medical records identifying the injuries sustained by Zimmerman on the evening of 2/26/2012. Said medical records list Zimmerman's injuries as:

1. Open wound of scalp, without mention of complication
2. Nasal bones, closed fracture
3. Assault by other specified means

On 03/10/2012 at approximately 1330 hours, I interviewed [REDACTED] at her residence, [REDACTED] whose identity was made known due to her having called 911 on 2/26/2012 at 1918 hours, agreed to being interviewed (digitally recorded) at her residence. Upon inquiry, [REDACTED] states she had just arrived home when she was about to let her dog go outside her back porch area when she heard a voice crying for help. She stated she looked through her back sliding glass door and observed an individual lying on the ground, apparently calling for help. She stated she observed a neighbor, whom she could not identify, asking the person on the ground if he was "okay" and if the person on the ground wanted him to call 911. [REDACTED] states that upon hearing the term "911", she chose to secure her sliding glass door, and retreated to the bathroom of the second floor of her townhome. She stated that as she raised the window of the bath room, in order see what was happening with the person laying on the ground, she heard a "pop" noise that she construed to be a gunshot. She stated that upon reacquiring a view of the occurrences, she observed a female and male giving CPR to the person on the ground. Upon inquiry, [REDACTED] states she did not witness anyone fighting with anyone, and she reiterated she did not witness the event in its entirety.

On 3/10/2012, at approximately 1310 hours, I attempted to contact [REDACTED] [REDACTED] in order to re-interview her pertaining to her 911 call placed on 2/26. I left a business card on her front door and have left two messages on her cell phone voice mail.

Investigative findings show that on 2/26/2012 at approximately 1912 hrs George Michael Zimmerman initiated a nonemergency call to Sanford Police dispatch to report a suspicious person. Zimmerman reported a suspicious person, Trayvon Martin, whom he observed entering the gated community of The Reserve at Twin Lakes on foot, walking between residences from the northwest. [REDACTED]

Investigation reveals that on August 3, August 4, and October 6, 2011, and February 2, 2012, George Zimmerman reported suspicious persons, all young Black males, in the Retreat neighborhood to the Sanford Police Department. According to records checks, all of Zimmerman's suspicious persons calls while residing in the Retreat neighborhood have identified Black males as the subjects.

At 1916 hours, a 911 call, placed by [REDACTED] was received where Zimmerman can be heard in the background frantically yelling for help. At 1917 hours a gunshot was heard in the background of the 911 call, and moments later Officer Tim Smith arrived on scene.

Attempts to locate additional witnesses have consisted of multiple canvasses of the neighborhood on the evenings of 2/26/2012, 2/27/2012, and 3/1/2012. The distribution of informational flyers throughout the gated community was completed on 2/29/2012 and a community meeting, which was held on March 1, 2012.

All digitally recorded interviews were submitted as evidence, and all forensic laboratory requests are being submitted to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement for analysis.

Based upon the facts and circumstances outlined in this narrative, I believe there exists probable cause for issuance of a capias charging George Michael Zimmerman with Manslaughter, in violation of Ch. 782.07 FS. This case is being forwarded to the Office of the State's Attorney as a request for capias.







DETAILS:

On 03/10/2012 at 1330 hours, I interviewed [REDACTED] at [REDACTED]. She stated she had just arrived at her residence at approximately 1900 on 2/26/2012. She stated she opened her back sliding glass door in order to let her dog out. Upon opening the door, she noticed her neighbor, believed to be [REDACTED] at his back porch. She noticed her neighbor talking to someone, and she noticed someone else, who she identified as "the kid", laying on the ground. She stated she could hear the person lying on the ground, making a groaning noise, which she enunciated as "ohh, ohh, help me, help me or something like that". She stated that at first she associated the sounds she heard as her elderly neighbor possibly having a heart attack. She stated she then heard her neighbor say "okay, I'm going to call 911". She stated that upon hearing her neighbor speak the numbers "911", she immediately pulled her dog into her residence, closed her sliding glass door, and set the door's alarm. She then went upstairs, in order to watch the occurrences from the safety of her upstairs restroom window, which faces the to the rear of her condo. She stated that as she opened the window in her restroom, she heard a "pop" sound, which she interpreted as a gunshot. [REDACTED] stated she could not be certain as to the exact time she heard the gunshot or "pop" sound. She stated that she then called 911. She stated she did not see anyone in her observations other than her neighbor, and the person on the ground. She stated she did not witness any type of arguing, fighting, or other physical contact between anyone. She stated she "must have come in after the fact", and she could not determine the ethnicity of the person on the ground. Upon completing our interview, [REDACTED] agreed to re-enact her steps, in order to establish an approximate time frame between her hearing her neighbor say "911", and the time she opened the window to the restroom of the second floor of her condo. Elapsed time was approximately 60 seconds.

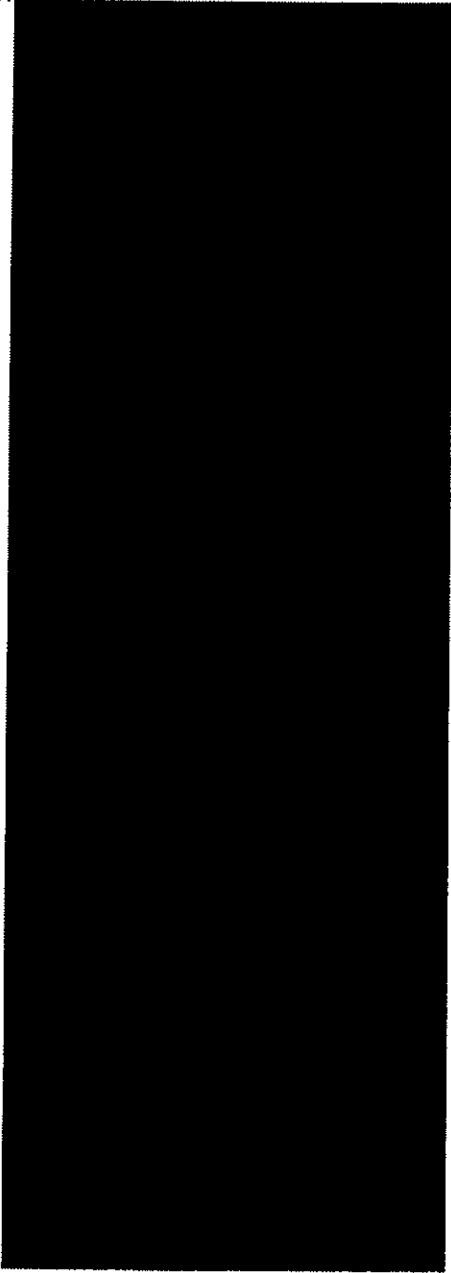

DETAILS:

On 02/26/2012 at approximately 1935 hours, I was contacted by Officer T. Smith in reference to responding to Retreat at Twin Lakes to process a homicide scene. I arrived on scene at approximately 1955 hours and met with Officer Ayala and Officer Mead who briefed me on the scene. Currently at this time in the evening, it was dark out and we were experiencing intermittent showers.



At that time, I walked through the scene with the officer's and they pointed out items of evidence that were already located, it was still raining at this time. It was dark outside, raining off and on, and there was not much light lighting up in the courtyard. There were a set of keys containing a small flash light that was on, a cell phone, larger flashlight, two plastic bags, first aid kit, medical supplies, the victim's body that was covered by a yellow medical blanket, and an Arizona tea can. According to Officer's on the scene, the Arizona tea can was originally located in the front pocket of the victim's jacket. I then retrieved my camera and started to photograph the scene while I waited for the Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office transport services to arrive. After my photographs of the initial scene were completed, Sgt Ciesla and I measured the items on the scene and then I collected them. The Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office arrived on scene and moved the victim. The victim had \$ 40.15 in US currency, a bag of skittles, red lighter, headphones, photo pin in his pockets or on him. I also noticed and documented that there was only a single gun shot wound to the chest. After the victim was transported, Sgt. Ciesla and I looked for a cartridge case while it was still raining. Sgt. Ciesla utilized a metal detector as I searched in the areas the detector would detect. A short time later, a 9mm Luger S&B cartridge case was located, documented, and recovered. All evidence will be transported to the Sanford Police Department and logged into evidence.

I responded to the Sanford Police Department on 01/26/2012 at approximately 2315 hours and met with Officer T. Smith. Officer T. Smith assisted me in meeting with the subject in interview room # 2 to photograph his clothing, injuries, hands, collect possible gun shot residue, and to collect his clothing. After I photographed Zimmerman's clothing, hands, and injuries, I asked him if he had any other injuries that were not visible. Zimmerman stated that he did not other than his back hurting but he did not think he had any cuts or bruises. A short time later, his wife arrived at the Sanford Police Department and provided us with a change of clothes for Zimmerman. At that time, Zimmerman changed his clothing and placed them into brown paper bags that I provided for him. When he was done changing, he was escorted back to the interview room. All of this evidence will be logged into evidence.

On 02/27/2012 at approximately 1235 hours, I responded to Retreat at Twin Lakes to take some photographs of the courtyard in the daylight.

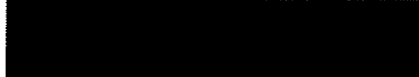
