Interviews with 1,517 adult Americans conducted by telephone by ORC International on June 28 - July 1, 2012. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 2.5 percentage points. The sample also includes 1,390 interviews among registered voters (plus or minus 2.5 percentage points).

The sample includes 1,138 interviews among landline respondents and 379 interviews among cell phone respondents.

Results reported for "battleground states" include 582 respondents and 534 registered voters who live in Arizona, Colorado, Florida, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Missouri, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Mexico, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Virginia and Wisconsin. Results for respondents in these 15 states are not comparable with results from other polls that use a different list of "battleground states."
