Interviews with 1,010 adult Americans conducted by telephone by ORC International on August 7-8, 2012. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 3 percentage points. The sample also includes 911 interviews among registered voters (plus or minus 3.5 percentage points).

The sample includes 760 interviews among landline respondents and 250 interviews among cell phone respondents.
