

Interviews with 1,013 adult Americans conducted by telephone by ORC International on September 28-30, 2012. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 3 percentage points.

The sample also includes 883 interviews among registered voters (plus or minus 3.5 percentage points) and 783 interviews among likely voters (plus or minus 3.5 percentage points).

The sample includes 756 interviews among landline respondents and 257 interviews among cell phone respondents.

METHODOLOGY

A total of 1,013 adults were interviewed by telephone nationwide by live interviewers calling both landline and cell phones. All respondents were asked questions concerning basic demographics, and the entire sample was weighted to reflect national Census figures for gender, race, age, education, region of country, telephone usage and whether respondents own or rent their homes. Registered voters were asked questions about their likelihood of voting, past voting behavior, and interest in the campaign; based on answers to those questions, 783 respondents were classified as likely voters. Respondents who reported that they had already cast an absentee ballot or voted early were automatically classified as likely voters.
