

Interviews with 262 respondents who describe themselves as Republicans and 205 who describe themselves as Independents who lean Republican, for a total of 467 Republicans. Interviews conducted by telephone by ORC International on March 15-17, 2013. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 3 percentage points.

NOTE: The following results do not represent the views of all Americans. Question 35 was asked only of Republicans and Independents who lean Republican.

METHODOLOGY

A total of 1,021 adults were interviewed by telephone nationwide by live interviewers calling both landline and cell phones. Among those interviews, 467 respondents described themselves as Republicans or as Independents who lean Republican. All respondents were asked questions concerning basic demographics, and the entire sample was weighted to reflect national Census figures for gender, race, age, education, region of country, and telephone usage.
