METHODOLOGY NOTE

ComRes interviewed 500 UK adults aged 18+, 500 French adults aged 18+ and 500 German adults aged 18+ online on 30th August 2013. Data were weighted by age, gender and region to be demographically representative of all UK, French and German adults aged 18+. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
