CNN | ORC POLL

Interviews with 801 adult Americans conducted by telephone by ORC International on March 7-9, 2014. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 3.5 percentage points.

The sample also includes 710 interviews among registered voters (plus or minus 3.5 percentage points)

The sample includes 558 interviews among landline respondents and 243 interviews among cell phone respondents.

QUESTION WORDING PRIOR TO AUGUST 2010: *As you may know, the U.S. House of Representatives and the U.S. Senate are trying to pass final legislation that would make major changes in the country's health care system. Based on what you have read or heard about that legislation, do you generally favor it or generally oppose it?*

QUESTION WORDING FOR AUGUST AND DECEMBER 2010: *As you may know, a bill that makes major changes to the country's health care system became law earlier this year. Based on what you have read or heard about that legislation, do you generally favor or generally oppose it?*

QUESTION WORDING FOR MARCH AND JUNE 2011: *As you may know, a bill that makes major changes to the country's health care system became law last year. Based on what you have read or heard about that legislation, do you generally favor or generally oppose it?*

METHODOLOGY

A total of 801 adults were interviewed by telephone nationwide by live interviewers calling both landline and cell phones. All respondents were asked questions concerning basic demographics, and the entire sample was weighted to reflect national Census figures for gender, race, age, education, region of country, and telephone usage. Among the entire sample, 29% described themselves as Democrats, 22% described themselves as Republicans, and 49% described themselves as Independents or members of another party

Crosstabs on the following pages only include results for subgroups with enough unweighted cases to produce a sampling error of +/- 8.5 percentage points or less. Some subgroups represent too small a share of the national population to produce crosstabs with an acceptable sampling error. Interviews were conducted among these subgroups, but results for groups with a sampling error larger than +/-8.5 percentage points are not displayed and instead are denoted with "N/A".
