

## KENTUCKY

In Kentucky, interviews with $\mathbf{1 , 0 3 7}$ adult Americans conducted by telephone by ORC International on August 28-September 1, 2014. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 3 percentage points. The Kentucky sample also includes 891 interviews among registered voters (plus or minus 3.5 percentage points) and 671 interviews among likely voters (plus or minus 4 percentage points). In Kentucky, 735 interviews were conducted among landline respondents and 302 interviews among cell phone respondents.

## METHODOLOGY

In Kentucky, a total of 1,037 adults were interviewed by telephone. All respondents were asked questions concerning basic demographics, and the entire sample was weighted to reflect statewide Census figures for gender, race, age, education and region of the state. Registered voters were asked questions about their likelihood of voting, past voting behavior, and interest in the campaign; based on the answers to those questions, 671 respondents were classified as likely voters. Among those likely voters, $40 \%$ described themselves as Democrats, $27 \%$ described themselves as Independents, and $34 \%$ described themselves as Republicans.

In the Kentucky crosstabs, the state regions are composed of the following counties: the "East" region is composed of Adair, Bath, Bell, Boyd, Breathitt, Carter, Casey, Clay, Clinton, Cumberland, Elliott, Estill, Fleming, Floyd, Greenup, Harlan, Jackson, Johnson, Knott, Knox, Laurel, Lawrence, Lee, Leslie, Letcher, Lewis, McCreary, Magoffin, Martin, Menifee, Metcalfe, Monroe, Montgomery, Morgan, Owsley, Perry, Pike, Powell, Pulaski, Rockcastle, Rowan, Russell, Wayne, Whitley and Wolfe counties; the "Bluegrass" region is composed of Anderson, Bourbon, Boyle, Clark, Fayette, Franklin, Garrard, Harrison, Jessamine, Lincoln, Madison, Mercer, Nicholas, Scott, Washington and Woodford counties; the "Northern KY/Louisville Suburbs" region is composed of Boone, Bracken, Bullitt, Campbell, Carroll, Gallatin, Grant, Henry, Kenton, Mason, Oldham, Owen, Pendleton, Robertson, Shelby, Spencer and Trimble counties; the "Jefferson County" region is composed of Jefferson county; and the "West" region is composed of Allen, Ballard, Barren, Breckinridge, Butler, Caldwell, Calloway, Carlisle,, Christian, Crittenden, Daviess, Edmonson, Fulton, Graves, Grayson, Green, Hancock, Hardin, Hart, Henderson, Hickman, Hopkins, Larue, Livingston, Logan, Lyon, McCracken, McLean, Marion, Marshall, Meade, Muhlenberg, Nelson, Ohio, Simpson, Taylor, Todd, Trigg, Union, Warren, Webster counties.

Crosstabs on the following pages only include results for subgroups with enough unweighted cases to produce a sampling error of $+/-8.5$ percentage points or less. Some subgroups represent too small a share of the population of Kentucky to produce crosstabs with an acceptable sampling error. Interviews were conducted among these subgroups but results for groups with a sampling error larger than $+/-8.5$ percentage points are not displayed.
