

## ARKANSAS

In Arkansas, interviews with $\mathbf{1 , 0 1 0}$ adult Americans conducted by telephone by ORC International on August 28-September 2, 2014. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 3 percentage points. The Arkansas sample also includes 839 interviews among registered voters (plus or minus 3.5 percentage points) and 523 interviews among likely voters (plus or minus 4.5 percentage points). In Arkansas, 709 interviews were conducted among landline respondents and 301 interviews among cell phone respondents.

## METHODOLOGY

In Arkansas, a total of 1,010 adults were interviewed by telephone. All respondents were asked questions concerning basic demographics, and the entire sample was weighted to reflect statewide Census figures for gender, race, age, education and region of the state. Registered voters were asked questions about their likelihood of voting, past voting behavior, and interest in the campaign; based on the answers to those questions, 523 respondents were classified as likely voters. Among those likely voters, $32 \%$ described themselves as Democrats, $40 \%$ described themselves as Independents, and 28\% described themselves as Republicans.

In the Arkansas crosstabs, the state regions are composed of the following counties: the "East" region is composed of Arkansas, Ashley, Bradley, Chicot, Clay, Cleveland, Craighead, Crittenden, Cross, Desha, Drew, Greene, Jackson, Jefferson, Lee, Lincoln, Mississippi, Monroe, Phillips, Poinsett, Prairie, St. Francis and Woodruff counties; the "North Central" region is composed of Cleburne, Faulkner, Fulton, Independence, Izard, Lawrence, Lonoke, Perry, Randolph, Saline, Sharp, Stone Van Buren and White counties; the "Pulaski" region is composed of Pulaski county; the "Northwest" region is composed of Baxter, Benton, Boone, Carroll, Conway, Crawford, Franklin, Johnson, Logan, Madison, Marion, Newton, Pope, Searcy Sebastian and Washington counties; and the "Southwest" region is composed of Calhoun, Clark, Columbia, Dallas, Garland, Grant, Hempstead, Hot Spring, Howard, Lafayette, Little River, Miller, Montgomery, Nevada, Ouachita, Pike, Polk, Scott, Sevier, Union and Yell counties.

Crosstabs on the following pages only include results for subgroups with enough unweighted cases to produce a sampling error of $+/-8.5$ percentage points or less. Some subgroups represent too small a share of the population of Arkansas to produce crosstabs with an acceptable sampling error. Interviews were conducted among these subgroups but results for groups with a sampling error larger than $+/-8.5$ percentage points are not displayed.
