

## New Hampshire

In New Hampshire, interviews with $\mathbf{1 , 0 2 3}$ adult Americans conducted by telephone by ORC International on October 18-21, 2014. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 3 percentage points. The New Hampshire sample also includes 877 interviews among registered voters (plus or minus 3.5 percentage points) and 645 interviews among likely voters (plus or minus 4 percentage points). In New Hampshire, 720 interviews were conducted among landline respondents and 303 interviews among cell phone respondents.

## METHODOLOGY

In New Hampshire, a total of 1,023 adults were interviewed by telephone. All respondents were asked questions concerning basic demographics, and the entire sample was weighted to reflect statewide Census figures for gender, race, age, education and region of the state. Registered voters were asked questions about their likelihood of voting, past voting behavior, and interest in the campaign; based on the answers to those questions, 645 respondents were classified as likely voters. Among those likely voters, $24 \%$ described themselves as Democrats, $48 \%$ described themselves as Independents, and 28\% described themselves as Republicans.

In the New Hampshire crosstabs, the state regions are composed of the following counties: the " Rockingham County" region is composed of Rockingham County; the " Hillsborough County" region is composed of Hillsborough County; the "South" region is composed of Cheshire County, Merrimack County, Strafford County, Sullivan County counties; the "North" region is composed of Belknap County, Carroll County, Coos County, Grafton County counties.

Crosstabs on the following pages only include results for subgroups with enough unweighted cases to produce a sampling error of $+/-8.5$ percentage points or less. Some subgroups represent too small a share of the population of New Hampshire to produce crosstabs with an acceptable sampling error. Interviews were conducted among these subgroups but results for groups with a sampling error larger than $+/-8.5$ percentage points are not displayed.
