At that time in my life I felt like I was missing something and I tried to fill that emptiness by selling drugs. It made me feel like I was somebody more than I was. It was all a lie though; selling drugs was not the answer. All that it did was lead me down a dark road that could have ended much worse for me besides getting a drug charge. I would say that I am somewhat fortunate to have gotten caught because it made me look at where my life was headed. I realized that I had to change things in my life and the biggest one being that I needed new friends. The crowd that I was hanging around did not have my best interest at heart and it showed the most when I got my charge. None of them were around when I needed them. I can say that since then I have been more selective with the people that I choose as my friends. I can also say that I have broken all ties with those who were my so called friends during the time of my arrest.

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Mr. Governor, I am asking for a second chance at life. I am asking for a second chance to be the man that I know that I can be. I am asking for a second chance so that I can be a better father to my two little girls and a better husband to my wife. I am asking for a second chance to be a better son to my parents and prove to them that I am the person they raised me to be. I made my mistake and feel as though I have paid my debt to society. As I mentioned, I have not gotten into any trouble since the time of my arrest. I have been an active contributing member of society, but with a strike against my record, it has prevented me from being my absolute best. With a clean record I will be able to do so much more with my life and for my family. Mr. Governor, if you could please find it in your heart to forgive me I will forever be grateful. I thank you for your consideration.

I am a different person now than I was then, with the biggest change being my maturity. I am now a husband and proud father of two little girls whom I love very much. Granting me a relief will give me an opportunity to provide for my family in the way that a man should. I no longer live my life on a path of destruction and recklessness because of my children. They have made me become a better person.

Being a father has given me countless life lessons that I try to apply in my daily life. My youngest daughter has taught me the true meaning of life as I have watched her battle cancer at such a young age. I do not take life for granted anymore. She has made me realize how precious life really is. I also saw the effects my actions had on my family, who did not raise me to that kind of person. With a relief I will have a second chance and I can assure you that I will not make the same mistake again.

Eleven years ago, I thought I could get a jumpstart on a successful life by selling drugs. I can tell you now that selling drugs is not the profession that I want. I was living in a fantasy world and thought it was cool to sell drugs. I can tell you now that drugs will only get you three places, and that is either dead, in a mental institution or prison. I did not consider that when I was younger, but now I know that neither is an option for me.

I come from a loving family and I have seen how my arrest has affected them. I have seen the turmoil it caused my father and mother. They did not raise me to be a criminal. They have only loved and supported me and I am blessed to have them. A relief would help me to show them that I can be who they raised me to be. A relief would also help me as a father and a better contributing member of society.

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11. My rehabilitation starts with my family. My wife and I are members of the Arkansas Children's Hospital Foundation Ambassador program. We became involved after our youngest daughter was diagnosed with cancer at 11 weeks old.

I have talked to several youth about drug activity and the pitfall of selling and using drugs. I told them about situations that I have been in because of the drugs. I discredited the entire lifestyle that is assumed drug dealers have. I talked to them about making the right decisions and how wrong choices can lead you to jail or worse, dead.

Since the time of my arrest I have stayed out of trouble. I have been a productive member of society. I also attended counseling for six months to help me with my drug related issues.
