

Conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center

Interviews with 820 adults in New Hampshire conducted by land line and cellular telephone on September 17-23, 2015 including 743 who say they plan to vote in the 2016 presidential election. The margin of sampling error for results based on general election voters is plus or minus 3.6 percentage points.

(GENERAL ELECTION VOTERS ONLY:)
