Interviews with 2,003 adult Iowans conducted by telephone by ORC International on November 28 - December 6, 2015. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 2 percentage points.

The sample also includes 552 who were likely to participate in the Republican presidential caucus and 442 who were likely to participate in the Democratic presidential caucus.

This sample includes $\mathbf{1 , 2 0 3}$ interviews among landline respondents and $\mathbf{8 0 0}$ interviews among cell phone respondents.

## METHODOLOGY

A total of 2,003 Iowa adults were interviewed by telephone statewide by live interviewers calling both landline and cellphones. All respondents were asked questions concerning basic demographics, and the entire sample was weighted to reflect statewide Census figures for gender, race, age, education and region of the state.

Respondents were asked questions about whether they are registered to vote, their likelihood of voting, past voting behavior, and interest in the campaign. Based on the answers to those questions, 1,266 respondents were classified as likely caucus-goers, including 552 who were likely to participate in the Republican presidential caucus and 442 who were likely to participate in the Democratic presidential caucus.
