



Interviews with 1,501 adult Americans conducted by telephone by ORC International on September 28 – October 2, 2016. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 2.5 percentage points.

The sample also includes 1,335 interviews among registered voters (plus or minus 2.5 percentage points), and 1,213 interviews among likely voters (plus or minus 3 percentage points).

This sample includes 751 interviews among landline respondents and 750 interviews among cell phone respondents.

METHODOLOGY

A total of 1,501 adults were interviewed by telephone nationwide by live interviewers calling both landline and cell phones. Among the entire sample, 27% described themselves as Democrats, 24% described themselves as Republicans, and 49% described themselves as independents or members of another party.

All respondents were asked questions concerning basic demographics, and the entire sample was weighted to reflect national Census figures for gender, race, age, education, region of country, and telephone usage.

Crosstabs on the following pages only include results for subgroups with enough unweighted cases to produce a sampling error of +/- 9.0 percentage points or less. Some subgroups represent too small a share of the national population to produce crosstabs with an acceptable sampling error. Interviews were conducted among these subgroups, but results for groups with a sampling error larger than +/-9.0 percentage points are not displayed and instead are denoted with "NA".
