

## ARIZONA

In Arizona, interviews with $\mathbf{1 , 0 0 5}$ adult Americans conducted by telephone by ORC International on October 27 - November 1, 2016. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 3 percentage points.

The Arizona sample also includes 867 interviews among registered voters (plus or minus 3.5 percentage points) and 769 interviews among likely voters (plus or minus 3.5 percentage points).

In Arizona, 505 interviews were conducted among landline respondents and 500 interviews among cell phone respondents.

## METHODOLOGY

A total of 1,005 Arizona adults were interviewed by telephone statewide by live interviewers calling both landline and cellphones. Interviews were conducted in English and Spanish, depending upon the respondent's preference. All respondents were asked questions concerning basic demographics, and the entire sample was weighted to reflect statewide Census figures for gender, race, age, education and region of the state. Interviews were conducted in English or Spanish depending on the respondent's preference.

This sample includes 505 interviews among landline respondents and 500 interviews among cell phone respondents.
Respondents were asked questions about whether they are registered to vote, their likelihood of voting, past voting behavior, and interest in the campaign. Based on the answers to those questions, 769 respondents were classified as likely voters. Among those likely voters, $27 \%$ described themselves as Democrats, $33 \%$ described themselves as Republicans, and $40 \%$ described themselves as Independents. For the sample of registered voters, $30 \%$ said they were registered as Democrats, $36 \%$ registered as Republicans, $33 \%$ registered with no party and $1 \%$ registered with another party.

The Arizona regions are composed of the following counties: the "Maricopa" region is composed of Maricopa county; the "Pima" region is composed of Pima county; the "Rest of the State" region is composed of Apache, Cochise, Coconino, Gila, Graham, Greenlee, La Paz, Mohave, Navajo, Pinal, Santa Cruz, Yavapai and Yuma counties.

Crosstabs on the following pages only include results for subgroups with enough unweighted cases to produce a sampling error of $+/-8.5$ percentage points or less. Some subgroups represent too small a share of the population of Arizona to produce crosstabs with an acceptable sampling error. Interviews were conducted among these subgroups but results for groups with a sampling error larger than $+/-8.5$ percentage points are not displayed.
