



Interviews with 509 adult Americans who watched the presidential speech conducted by telephone (landline and cell) by ORC International on February 28, 2017. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 4.5 percentage points.

Survey respondents were first interviewed as part of a random national sample conducted February 24-27, 2017. In those interviews, respondents indicated they planned to watch tonight's speech and were willing to be re-interviewed after the speech.

33% of the respondents who participated in tonight's survey identified themselves as Republicans, 28% identified themselves as Democrats, and 39% identified themselves as independents.

METHODOLOGY

A total of 509 adult Americans who watched the speech were interviewed by telephone nationwide by live interviewers calling both landline and cell phones. Among the entire sample, 28% described themselves as Democrats, 33% described themselves as Republicans, and 39% described themselves as independents or members of another party.

Crosstabs on the following pages only include results for subgroups with enough unweighted cases to produce a sampling error of +/- 8.5 percentage points or less. Some subgroups represent too small a share of the national population to produce crosstabs with an acceptable sampling error. Interviews were conducted among these subgroups, but results for groups with a sampling error larger than +/-8.5 percentage points are not displayed and instead are denoted with "NA".
