### EMBARGOED FOR RELEASE: Thursday, July 20 at 6:00 a.m.

The study was conducted for CNN via telephone by SSRS, an independent research company. Interviews were conducted from July 14 – July 18 2017 among a sample of 1,019 respondents. The landline total respondents were 405 and there were 614 of cell phone respondents. The margin of error for total respondents is +/-3.7% at the 95% confidence level.
